A Year of CHALLENGE, TRUST and COMMITMENT



We were thrilled to begin this academic year with the largest number of students ever to study at HAC, a number double the size our student body just 8 years ago, when I first took the helm as President. Unlike other institutions of higher education, our sustained growth has been driven by a number of unique advantages: our career-oriented degree programs, solid reputation for preparing students to obtain good jobs upon graduation, our ability to accommodate and nurture special populations who until recent years had restricted access to higher education, and the close personal attention that we afford our students.

We were very excited earlier this year when the Azrieli Foundation approved a generous grant to match a grant made by our committed partners and wonderful friends at the Russel Berrie Foundation, to help us fulfill our dream to build and establish Israel's first Center for Diversity and Inclusion for our students.

When the coronavirus arrived in Israel, we knew that we had to do everything in our power to keep our students and staff safe, while making every effort to function effectively to allow our students to continue in their academic programs. We began our Spring Semester by moving all our courses

on-line, and spent considerable resources and energies to aide our staff and students to become accustomed to the nuances of remote learning. Our IT team and student support services worked intensively to provide the support needed to undertake this transition successfully. Due to the spirit of cooperation that epitomizes the faculty and staff at HAC, and the unique relationship that we enjoy with the HAC Students' Association, we have successfully enabled our students to continue this semester almost seamlessly. We are now making every attempt to get back to the business of teaching on campus, and our operations staff have instituted all the necessary provisions to reopen our facilities to ensure the maximum health and well-being of our students and staff.

Unfortunately, many of our students (who typically work part-time jobs to support themselves) were hit hard by the sudden and prolonged closure of the economy. We have done everything we can to help them - and made whatever accommodations we could. We were fortunate this year to be able to offer no-interest loans to a much larger number of students, in cooperation with our generous partners at the Magbit Foundation. We wish we could do more to support our students, but our resources are strictly limited.

In this report, we are particularly proud to highlight the contributions made by some of our faculty and graduates from our Departments of Medical Laboratory Sciences and Biotechnology, who were centrally involved here during the COVID-19 pandemic through their extraordinary efforts

to conduct diagnostic testing, carry out cutting-edge research, and provide support for the healthcare system. We have already reopened our state-of-the-art laboratories, and hope to continue to interest future generations of students in the critical role that these healthcare fields play for the future of Israel, and all of mankind. At this time, our registration statistics for next year look favorable for both of these departments, and we have aspirations, despite the difficulties of the last few months, to open the 2020-2021 academic year with yet a further increase in our total number of students.

I want to extend a warm welcome to our new Department Chairs, Prof. Avi Besser, and Dr. Zvika Afik, who joined HAC this year, and about whom you can learn more in the following pages. They join our own long-standing faculty members Ms. Judith Guetta, and Dr. Ayelet Arbel-Eden, who were promoted to Chair their respective departments.

Along with our entire teaching faculty and administrative staff, we are even more committed to our mission of preparing the next generation of young Israelis, from all sectors and populations, for meaningful careers, and to become fully contributing members of Israeli society.

I would like to thank the members of our Board of Trustees and Executive Committee for their commitment and support. I am pleased to share this year's President's Report with you - our friends and supporters - without whom all these pursuits would simply not have been possible.

This year HAC continued to focus on the 'secrets' of its success, which help explain the College's phenomenal growth during the last 8 years, and the remarkable success of its students and graduates.

Learning Together

Students from a wide variety of backgrounds learn side by side in a remarkable environment of tolerance, respect, and mutual understanding. Earlier this year, thirty two students participated in the fifth annual **Jewish-Arab Dialogue Program**, an elective class of joint activities for Jewish and Arab Israeli students that was designed to create familiarity with each other's cultures, break down stereotypes, and foster cultural sensitivity. This year, participants topped off the program of musical events, field trips, and culinary adventures with an arts workshop in which they designed an integrated Hebrew-Arabic font for the word "together" to express their newly learned shared language of respect.



SPIRIT of Community Service

Students are committed to volunteer for the benefit of less fortunate members of the community.

In addition to presenting awards for academic excellence, the Dean of Students annually presents the Dean's Awards for Excellence in Community Service. This year HAC bestowed honors upon twenty students who demonstrated outstanding community-building efforts through exceptional volunteer work with organizations serving the elderly, the disabled, youth at-risk, and other needy populations in both East and West Jerusalem. HAC fosters this spirit of community service by requiring each student who receives financial aid to volunteer a minimum of 50 hours with one of some forty schools and community-based organizations throughout the City.



Prepared for the Workforce

Students at HAC study in practical, career-oriented academic degree programs, are groomed to enter the workforce upon graduation, and become effectively employed in extraordinary numbers.

HAC's **Career Counseling Center** is a campus hotspot. One in three students obtains critical guidance and participates in the Center's workshops, and more than one thousand students typically attend its annual Spring Job Fair. The newly expanded Internship Program allows a significant number of students to obtain credit and gain valuable employment experience through on-the-job-training. In light of the current situation, the Center is now assisting many more alumni too, by offering job search seminars and social media networking workshops, and is also poised to launch a mentoring program especially designed for ultra-Orthodox computer science students. The Center's success in helping students prepare for the workforce, and by serving as a model for other Israeli institutions of higher education, persuaded the **Edmond de Rothschild Foundation**, which first established the Center in 2014, to renew its generous support for the next three years.



A Diverse and Inclusive Environment



HAC is establishing the Azrieli Center for Diversity and Inclusion, to strengthen efforts to absorb and retain students from a wide variety of backgrounds, and accommodate their unique learning needs in order to ensure their success in higher education.

Advanced steps are underway to establish the **Azrieli Center** for Diversity and Inclusion, the first center of its kind at any Israeli college or university. The Center is being made possible through generous grants from the Azrieli Foundation, together with the **Russell Berrie Foundation**. The Center will support the absorption and retention of students from underprivileged, underrepresented, and minority backgrounds, including the ultra-Orthodox, Arab-Israelis, Ethiopian-Israelis, and new immigrants, and will help integrate students with physical and learning disabilities, and those with emotional challenges. The Center will enable HAC to better coordinate and expand the critical services it provides through the Office of the Dean of Students, the Henrietta Szold Challenge Center, and Career Counseling Center, which together provide support for HAC's student body, and ensure the success of every individual student.



ACCELERATING BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

The Jerusalem Development Authority approved the establishment of the **HAC Accelerator**, a technological innovation hub and laboratory for entrepreneurship. The Accelerator will be a dynamic environment in which students and graduates can learn how to design innovative start-up ideas, develop business models and acquire marketing strategies, and network with venture capitalists, intellectual property attorneys, accountants, and other mentors. HAC looks forward to enabling students, faculty, and alumni to collaborate on both cutting-edge business and social ventures, and to putting HAC squarely on the map of the Start-Up Nation.

Azrieli Gallery: SEEING and BEING SEEN

The **Azrieli Gallery** at HAC was established to bring our design and photography students into the larger art world, and to draw the public onto HAC's downtown campus. This year, the Gallery already produced three new exhibitions with public opening events, guided tours, and artist talks. The exhibitions included: "The Seer and the See," which drew upon the College's historic Jerusalem location on Prophets Street; "Lines of Action," which explored the common ties between photography, animation, and illustration; and "Taking Stock," which highlighted the work of more than twenty HAC alumni. The Azrieli Gallery has quickly earned a respected place on Jerusalem's cultural landscape by addressing the City's contrasts and complexities—Jewish and Arab, secular and religious, national and international—through the fields of photography, the visual arts, and design.





Activities of Faculty and Graduates of HAC's Departments of

Medical Laboratory Sciences and

Biotechnology during the

COVID-19 Pandemic

This spring, when **Dr. Ayelet Arbel-Eden**, Chair of the Department of Medical Laboratory Sciences at HAC, wasn't teaching on-line, she took a very active role in Israel's national effort to contain COVID-19. Dr. Arbel-Eden voluntarily joined the new staff formed to support the virology laboratory at Hadassah Medical Center in Jerusalem, in order to double the number of diagnostic tests it was able to perform in a day, and to accelerate the pace of providing these results to the individuals being tested.

Dr. Tamar Grossman, another HAC faculty member who lectures in the area of parasitology, and who manages Israel's National Parasitology Center, also volunteered to help establish a number of new diagnostic laboratories to identify carriers of the coronavirus. Recently, Dr. Grossman was working at the Ministry of Health's central COVID-19 laboratory at Sheba Tel HaShomer Medical Center, and helped establish another new diagnostic laboratory in Jerusalem. To prepare for her role, she was coached by her former student - Ayelet Peretz, a graduate of HAC's Department of Medical Laboratory Sciences. Ayelet Peretz performs a critical role in the operation of the QIASymphony - a sophisticated diagnostic robot, which simultaneously produces RNA from 96 samples from the individuals being tested. Ayelet instructed Dr. Arbel-Eden in the operating procedures of the robot, and Arbel-Eden summarized their meeting as follows: "we learn something from everyone who has ever taught us, but from our students, we learn even more."



Involvement in COVID-19 Research

We are happy to present **Dr. Leah Braz**, a Senior Lecturer in HAC's Department of Medical Laboratory Sciences, and a researcher in the laboratory of Dr. Alex Robinsky, of the Hadassah Hebrew University School of Medicine. Dr. Braz took an active part in a research project investigating COVID-19. The research will expand the wealth of knowledge




about the body's immunizing response to the virus, and help to



isolate the most effective antibodies in order to provide them as a treatment to people who become sick from the virus. The second direction of her research involves decoding the mechanism by which the coronavirus gains entry into human cells.

Dr. Braz summarized this laboratory research experience with the following: "I am happy to participate in this fascinating research which has a real-life application, and in the process of thinking together about how to cope with this new virus, which did not even exist until just a few months ago."

We praise our academic staff and graduates for their professional work and their research contributions to understanding COVID-19.

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
